What is Junior Achievement?

Life situations may include items such as: marital status, number of children, career, monthly budget, mortgage, car loan, credit status, investment portfolio, savings and philanthropy. Students will work through their day paying bills, purchasing items (houses, clothing, car, etc.) and managing their money through an online simulation.
